Dainal Jacob's mother died of H.I.V. when he was two years and he lost his father at the age of five.

His grandmother took custody of the child and he lived with her under a rickety staircase a few blocks away from Prem Dan.

Couple of years later he was admitted into our Garden School and within a short time he disappeared and we could find no trace of him.

Again after a year he appeared in a worse condition than when formerly he came to us.

However we could not reject him and started the process of reeducating him all over again. Finally in June2009 we have admitted him in Std I into a secure Boarding School called Our Lady's Home run by the Diocesan Clergy.

His joy was so great when he entered the dormitory and saw his bed, he jumped into it and exclaimed "At last I have a bed to sleep on!"

We hope and work towards a bright future for Dainal.



Mass Media Students send a message

On September 17 and 18, 2009 the students and faculty at Prem Dan Garden School had the pleasure of watching skits put on by mass media students from St. Xavier's College and Wilson's College; respectively. The idea was conjured up by sociology teacher Reena Agrawal in order for media students to fully grasp the power of influence of the media, and to obtain a deeper clarification of the

target audience, in this case, children under ten years of age.

and Giselle, contained a
central theme of the

be treated, played out in a story of why we should not cheat others. The students especially enjoyed Raveena's enthusiasm and giggled at her exceptional performance. Afterwards, they played a game called "Fire on the Mountain" with the children, where raw kindness in young hearts was demonstrated when places in the groups formed were given up to friends in acts of sacrifice. It was much fun to be a spectator of such joyful human activity.


The students said, "Children are fun, we were able to revert back to our own childhood imaginations in creating this project and it was delightful to recap on our own experiences from youth with some improvisation onstage." Mass media students added that they learned valuable lessons themselves that will be applied throughout their careers such as obtaining a thorough understanding of the audience in order to better target and engage them using maneuvers like walking among them asking yes/no questions and periodic recapping of the story.

On Friday, the next day, we had the pleasure of watching a different media class of Ms. Reena's, this time from Wilson's College. The message conveyed in this skit was "United we stand, divided we fall," where a family who worked together was able to find the treasure and defeat the evil demon while their attempts to escape victoriously alone came up short. Their play was in Hindi, recreating a traditional tale. The evil demon made the children roar with laughter as he grumbled and growled amidst the audience with his long haired costume on. The media students then led the group in team races to exercise the lesson learned. They commented afterwards, "Although it's more difficult to hold on to the attention of a child, the entire effort was made worthwhile when we saw all the children smile 'at our silly antics'. All in all it was quite the treat for everyone to witness two very entertaining and wholesome skits.
